



COVID-19 IMPORTANT UPDATE – Lakeside Community
November 27th 2020

To all Lakeside Community

As you may have seen in the news, the West Australian Government have announced that certain WA businesses will be required to re-introduce contact tracing measures, effective from the 5th of December 2020. Lakeside fall under many of these categories, for both church and recreation centre, which means we need to be ready to meet these new demands.

The good news is that there is an easy solution, with the government releasing the SafeWA app. This will make signing into a location very simple, and it seems most businesses will run with this platform. All that will be required is to scan a QR code upon entry, so that your details as well as time of entry will be stored only for 28 days. This will be a requirement for ALL Lakeside patrons with every visit to scan in upon arrival, until advised otherwise. The app is available from the applicable app stores, and is a free app.

There will multiple QR codes as you enter lakeside, as well as multiple QR codes over at Kennedy for people who are attending their facility. This process will be an addition to other current sign in processes for referees and gym and fitness class entry, which still need to be followed.

The Lakeside church congregation will also be required to follow the same procedure and scan the QR as they enter Lakeside. Additionally, we will also have manual sign in sheets for anyone who enters lakeside that will not have access to the SafeWA app. This will be on the left just inside the main entrance door, with signage so that it can't be missed. It is also important to note that this regulation only applies to people over the age of 16. People entering to collect takeaway coffee from the Timeout café are also exempt.

Please rest assured that we will hold any manual sign in sheets electronically for a period of 28 days before removing from our system.

We are going to need all of our community to help out while we embed this new process. Please be patient with any extended queues while we are ensuring that everyone is signed in, and we will work hard to ensure our processes as smooth and efficient as possible. We want to ensure that Lakeside remains a safe place to visit at any time, and have the right to refuse entry to anyone who fails to comply with this regulation.
