This project will aim to raise money towards Baptist World Aid's ongoing work in Cambodia where BWA Partners are working to care for the vulnerable and support sustainable change. This work reaches thousands of individuals across more than 13 communities in the following areas:

What will the money be used for?

Community Development

Our Partners work with communities to identify the causes of poverty and learn new ways to use their strengths to build sustainable solutions. Activities include water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH), education, vocational training and microfinance.

Church Partnership for Community Transformation

Partnering with local churches to lead community development programs, including training and capacity building for youth and community leaders in the areas of livelihood support, health, sanitation, education, savings groups.

Children, Youth & Communities For Change

Our Child Sponsorship and Vulnerable Children Fund programs work with children and youth, families, and communities to establish education and empowerment places that nurture child and youth wellbeing, with the aim of facilitating long-term change and creating a better future for all young people.

Disaster Management

Partners help communities prepare for, respond to, and recover from disasters, with a focus on resilience and recovery.

Advocacy

Australian supporters and churches are encouraged to advocate for justice through giving, ethical choices, prayer, and raising awareness for those living in poverty.

Global Projects

The Love Mercy Foundation is dedicated to empowering communities in northern Uganda to overcome poverty and heal from the impacts of civil conflict. Established in 2008 by Australian Olympian Eloise Wellings and Ugandan Olympian Julius Achon, the foundation focuses on sustainable, locally-led development. The foundation has positively impacted thousands of lives, fostering long-term change through its community-driven approach.

With this project we will be raising money to support Love Mercy's Cents for Seeds program, which is a micro-loan project in northern Uganda. Uganda is home to some of the most fertile land in the world. However, in the years following the civil war, the people did not have anything to farm with - enter, Cents for Seeds. Women in Uganda are the caretakers for their families. Therefore, by us investing in these women we will be subsequently investing in their larger communities. Cents for Seeds offers women the opportunity to earn an income, income which then turns into food, education, and health care.

Beginning in 2010 with just 100 women, Cents for Seeds has reached over 27,800 women, with 2,550 women graduated from the program and farming independently in 3 sub-counties

What will the money be used for?

The money raised will go towards directly impacting 167 women who will be provided with a life changing loan of seeds to sustainability support their children and local community by providing food, education and health care.

Destiny Rescue is a global Christian non-governmental organisation (NGO) that has restored hope to thousands of children enduring sexual exploitation and human trafficking through rescue operations and reintegration programming operated in regions throughout Africa, Asia and Latin America.

By building strong partnerships with government entities, law enforcement and like-minded organisations, we continue to expand our work and offer freedom to children in need across the globe.

We're so grateful thousands of survivors have bravely accepted that offer and are continuing their journey toward freedom. Rescue alone doesn't ensure freedom.

Post-rescue, a survivor's next steps are determined based on his or her unique situation, including the vulnerabilities that led to exploitation and local legal procedure. When a child enters our care, we carefully address each unique vulnerability that led to her exploitation.

Each survivor enrolled in our programming receives support to return to school or achieve financial independence. During their enrolment, children participate in dynamic trauma resilience training and hear the saving message of the gospel.

What will the money be used for?

The average cost is \$1800 to free a child from sexual slavery and help them begin a new life of freedom. Our money raised will go towards rescuing 3-4 children from sex slavery.
